1. Title of the Practice: Gyan ke Liye Vittiya Anudaan

Objective of the Practice:

The courses of Home Science are designed to make self-reliant through skill-based courses and keeping in mind to increase enrolment in such courses. Women have to face high level of fertility and mortality, poor nutritional status, poor financial status and little autonomy. Higher education in girl's leads to higher dowry demands and proverbs like raising girls is like watering someone else's lawn.

The context.

Fund based on financial circumstances is called need-based assistance and uniqueness of this feature is all fund collected is put in bank and dispersed as and when required and data is maintained creating transparency in the system.

This fund has helped may students in past to complete higher education and apart from that students who were active in sports and were representing college in university or zonal and state level were also given assistance in form of sports kits.

The Practice:

To make this a transparent practice a bank account is opened in a nearby bank and signatories are Principal and two senior staff. The money is donated by the staff members as and when required. Students are asked to attend classes regularly and even counselled that once they finish college and start earning, they give back to the college. This is one of its kind of Anudaan not seen in any of the institutions at nearby place.

Evidence of Success:

This year 54,440 Rs was paid by the college fund.

Problems encountered and resources required.

No major problems are encountered and there is no dearth of resources if required for such causes but it is difficult to identify the genuineness of the students of such students.

2. Title of the Practice: Institutional Social Responsibility

Objective of the Practice:

We as institution also want to inculcate moral, ethical values through various activities. The students should know their rights and obligations in different sectors of society so in future also they work for upliftment and empower the society specially the student.

The context.

Problems encountered and resources required.

The only constraints were the ongoing covid -19 problems which made participation at large scale little bit difficult as getting consent from parents was difficult. Being girls' college, all activities are conducted in the college hours only.
